6 COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT UPDATE –

Dale Wright, Community Engagement Officer, presented three projects:

Kembla Community Visioning – The Kembla Community Vision Plan is a project that Council will be working on for the next 2 years. The plan aims to bring together the different views, values, and aspirations for the Mount Kembla Heights area. The plan will list actions to achieve the community's vision. These actions will most likely belong to Council, as well as other organisations, agencies, and major landholders in the area such as South 32. Various engagement activities have been undertaken with the communities of Mount Kembla and Kembla Heights.

Feedback is being sought from the Aboriginal community.

Feedback from the Aboriginal Reference Group:

- Walking tracks
- Mt Kembla is a site of significance for local Aboriginal people, and this should be noted.
- A plaque or memorial recognising Aboriginal heritage should be placed on site.
- A mountain bike track should not be developed.
- A memorial in honour of the mine history and miners who lost their lives.
- Miners' cottage to be preserved.

- Create a 'roadmap' of places of significance.
- Provide video information (played on loop) explaining the history of significance along walking tracks.

Hill 60 – A meeting was held on Tuesday 1 August 2023 with Aboriginal stakeholders to discuss the Hill 60 accessibility and viewing area upgrades, and to begin discussions about the content for the signs and artwork. Wollongong Council has received funding to complete upgrades such as toilets, car parking, and creating better views. The upgrade is to take place at the Marine Rescue headland area which overlooks Five Islands and Port Kembla Harbour. The viewing area will incorporate interpretive artwork celebrating the site's rich Aboriginal heritage as well as recognising the site's military significance. Some of the works include:

- Installation of high-quality concrete pavements for an accessible footpath and the viewing area.
- Pavement art about the heritage of Hill 60.
- Installation of corrosion resistant safety balustrading, with heritage signage.
- Landscaping and tree planting.

So far, we have heard feedback about sharing stories on interpretive signs and in pavement art to recognise the significance of Hill 60. This includes families living on the hill and being forcibly removed, recognising local Aboriginal people who fought and died for their country in world wars, and recognising and celebrating the fishing culture. It was also suggested that a yarning circle be included in a future stage of works. The idea was to create a special place for local schools and groups to be able to utilise as part of outdoor programs. Aboriginal stakeholder engagement will continue over the coming months.

Feedback from the Aboriginal Reference Group:

Add a statue or memorial at Hill 60 in honour of the Aboriginal soldiers that went to war, in conjunction with Aboriginal culture and artwork.

West Dapto – Council has received funding from the State Government to master plan two shopping areas at West Dapto: Fowlers Village Centre and Marshall Mount Town Centre.

Feedback from the Aboriginal Reference Group:

An overlapping map of the archaeological map should be included in the master planning process.

7 CULTURE MIX UPDATE –

Sam Crosby and Carla Yamine have been working on the feedback and recommendations noted at the Aboriginal Reference Group meeting held on Wednesday 14 June 2023 regarding the performers for Culture Mix.
